POLICY

SA Equip are very aware of the impact that our business can have on the wider community and we are committed to achieving best practice in Social Responsibility. This includes ensuring that all our activities comply with the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

We are committed to acting ethically and implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking are not taking place within our supply chain or any part of our business.

TRAINING

We provide training to our employees involved in supplier selection to increase their awareness and understanding of the signs of modern slavery and human trafficking.

Imported goods from sources from outside the UK and EU are potentially more at risk for slavery/human trafficking issues. The level of management control required for these sources will be continually monitored.

We have also made our procurement staff aware of the steps they must take to counter this criminal activity should they know or suspect it is taking place. Our Directors and Managers have also been briefed on this subject and are aware of their commitment to check for compliance within our supply chain.

OUR COMMITMENT

- We internally review our supply chain to evaluate human trafficking and slavery risks
- We expect all those in our supply chain to comply with our values
- We require from those suppliers who we have identified as high risk a statement of their commitment and the actions they have taken to eliminate modern slavery
- The company will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in slavery or human trafficking

This Policy statement will be reviewed annually and will be made publicly available.
